## March 18 ➔ Limited Scope Training @ 10:45 - 3

On March 18, the Lawyer Referral Service of Central Texas and the Travis County Law Library will present CLE training on Limited Scope Representation.

Judge Sue Talia, a nationally-recognized expert on the subject, will present the training via a live webcast.

The 4-hour training will start at 10:45 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom on the 1st floor of the Granger Building at 11th & Guadalupe.

As part of the program, a standard contract for Limited Scope Representation will be made available.

Limited Scope Representation is also called "unbundled" or "discreet service" representation.

**Limited Scope is the new-but-old concept of providing specific legal services to a client rather than full representation.**

The attorney may draft documents or give advice, but the client is responsible for all other aspects of a case.

Middle or low-income clients who might otherwise have to handle a legal problem completely on their own may be able to pay for some legal help. The client pays at the time of service for the specific help provided without having to come up with a retainer. Unless a lawyer makes a formal appearance, it will not be necessary for the lawyer to seek an order permitting withdrawal.

Some pitfalls exist, but most can be avoided by scrupulous use of a written agreement, clearly stating the tasks and issues for which the lawyer will be responsible.
